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SACHRP's July 30-31 Meeting to Feature New Members, Informed Consent Discussions

The Secretary's Advisory Committee on Human Research Protections (SACHRP) is scheduled to meet for the first time this year July 30–31, following the cancellation of its March gathering due to a lack of members. According to a notice in today's *Federal Register*, the agenda includes discussions on a variety of topics including end-user licensing agreements, charging subjects to participate in trials, site monitoring under single institutional review board review, and "guidance for institutions affected by the end of the voluntary check-the-box option to extend a federalwide assurance to all research regardless of funding."

The meeting will also feature a presentation by a panel of experts on the topic of deceased organ intervention research "with a particular focus on recipient informed consent," the notice states. SACHRP typically meets three times a year, but due to a lack of timely appointments for members whose terms expired, HHS scrapped the March meeting. Following appointments made in June, SACHRP is now up to its full, 11-member capacity ("Patient Advocate, 3 With Drug Cos. Among Incoming SACHRP Members," *RRC* 16, no. 7). The meeting will be webcast live both days and archived.
