

Report on Medicare Compliance Volume 33, Number 8. March 04, 2024 Example of Draft Authorization for Disclosure of Substance Use Disorder Records Under Final Part 2 Rule

HHS finalized the Confidentiality of Substance Use Disorder Patient Records regulation in the Feb. 16*Federal Register*.^[1] The rule—42 C.F.R. Part 2—goes a long way towards harmonizing with HIPAA and the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act. Part 2 programs are now subject to the breach notification obligations of HIPAA and its civil and criminal penalties instead of the criminal penalties of the original law. It also provides for a new one-time consent form that mirrors HIPAA's, allows redisclosure of Part 2 records, and builds a fortress around so-called SUD counseling notes.^[2] This draft authorization was developed by UofL Health in Kentucky.
